5th Grade Social Studies Useful Definitions Week 1: Civil Rights Movement: A movement with the goal of giving everyone equal rights as citizens regardless of their skin color, gender, nationality, religion, disability, or age. The movement wanted to make sure that every person's rights were equally protected by the law, including free speech, assembly, and the right to a fair trial. The Civil Rights Movement occured in the United States in the 1960s. The Civil Rights Movement's most famous participants include Martin Luther King, Jr. and Rosa Parks. Cesar Chavez: Also in the 1960s, Chavez fought for equal rights for migrant workers. He grew up on a migrant working farm in California and saw that the workers on these farms were not treated with respect or given equal rights in California.
